Coursework in school counseling typically includes classes in counseling techniques, academic development and social and behavioral issues, as well as the ethics of counseling. Students pursuing employment as a college counselor will also complete courses in career guidance counseling, crisis intervention, and trauma counseling". As a school counselor, the student issues that you will encounter are enigmatic and it is your job to be able to resolve the student issues in an expeditious manner. Unfortunately, the solutions that you propose as a school counselor to resolve student issues may not be the optimal solutions for the students and you have no way of ascertaining whether or not they will elicit a salubrious outcome until these proposed solutions are followed. The challenge of a school counselor entails being able to resolve ongoing student issues that can be arduous to resolve. Prospective school counselors are typically required to complete an internship or practicum. "Most master's degree programs in school counseling include a practicum, or internship, as part of the core curriculum".

Character, Liberty and Law Mar 29 2020 Jeffrie G.
